<p>Learning objectives for the training</p>	<p>Learning outcomes for the participants include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An awareness of Autism Victoria’s role in supporting individuals with ASD • An increased knowledge and understanding of the different subtypes of ASD and their associated features/characteristics • An understanding of and ability to implement effective core strategies • An understanding of the elements of communication, including aspects of communication, non-verbal/verbal communication, fundamental and high-level language, and augmentative/alternative communication (AAC) • An understanding of the legislation and factors affecting service provision for individuals with ASD • A basic understanding of the Helping Children with Autism Plan & Medicare initiatives
<p>About the training content</p>	<p>Autism Spectrum Disorders are a ‘spectrum’ of neurodevelopmental disorders which affect 1/160 individuals in Australia. In December 2008, a decision was made by the Victorian State Government to acknowledge Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) as a neurological impairment under the Disability Act 2006. In order for professionals to best support the needs of individuals with ASD, Autism Victoria, in partnership with the Department of Human Services (DHS), is offering intake and case management staff from the North West region of metropolitan Melbourne a two day training workshop.</p> <p>In providing this educational opportunity, Autism Victoria will be able to play a key role in strengthening the ASD expertise of the workforce. The two day workshop will include an introduction to Autism Spectrum Disorders, an examination of the subtypes and characteristics underpinning each, an introduction to a core strategy framework which will guide participants in how to best support the needs of an individual with an ASD, a discussion about legislative implications and funding options for individuals throughout the lifespan, information about maximising outcomes for individuals accessing services and an introduction to communication and augmentative/alternative communication (AAC).</p> <p>It is expected that the theory provided within this training will be contextualised and grounded in the experiential knowledge and history of participants. It is anticipated that there will be opportunity for discussion about the interface between theory and practice within the broader case management and planning framework.</p>
